

Hello, Oakbrook!

I am officially announcing my retirement from the Board when my term is up in November. After 4 great years on the board, I have moved out of the neighborhood and, while I still own my Oakbrook house – it is time to pass the torch. So far we have had 37% participation in dues payment for 2023 resulting in just under \$6000 raised. This year marks about a 7% increase in the number of households paying dues YoY which is a HUGE help considering the rising costs of maintaining our beautiful neighborhood. We spend money on activities like the Fourth of July Parade, Dumpster Days, neighborhood beautification such as weed spraying and sign upkeep, and covenant enforcement which keeps our home values high. Legal Brief

Happy Fall! With the changing of seasons also comes more legislative updates. HOAs have been the subject of many legislative sessions over the last two years. We are seeing this trend continue into late 2023 and expect more changes as we move into 2024. The HOA Task Force members have now been named and will be charged with reviewing HOAs and looking at homeowner rights/responsibilities versus HOA rights/responsibilities. The other major legislation that has passed this year is a push toward more acceptance of Xeriscape within Colorado HOAs. We want to do our part in encouraging water-wise landscaping in Oakbrook. We have created and adopted a policy regarding Xeriscape and the use of drought resistant plants, vegetable gardens and artificial turf. Please review our website under the Governing Docs - Policies tab on the main page to read the Xeriscape policy if you are starting to plan for next year's landscape changes. As a reminder, any changes to landscape do need to be submitted and approved by the Covenant Committee.
